AGI Webinar: Linking AP Courses and Earth Science Literacy with Departmental Sustainability

Alexandria, VA – The American Geological Institute Workforce Program is holding a free webinar on January 26th from 1:30 – 2:30 pm EST linking AP courses and earth science literacy with college and university department sustainability as part of the GeoConnection Webinar Series.
